PREVIEW

Explanation:

All marriages celebrated in the Catholic or Orthodox Churches are presumed valid. If neither spouses are Catholic or Orthodox, every marriage is presumed to be valid.

- 1. If the previous marriage ended through death or a Tribunal decree** the person is free to remarry. If the current marriage took place before the former spouse died or a Tribunal declared the previous marriage invalid, and if at least one spouse was Catholic, the current marriage needs to be convalidated.
- 2. If the previous marriage included at least one spouse baptized Catholic or Orthodox but the wedding did not take place in the Catholic Church, Orthodox Church, or in another place with the permission of the Church,** complete a "Lack of Form" petition.
- 3. If neither spouse was baptized at the time of the wedding and now you will be baptized after the divorce,** there may be grounds to dissolve the marriage via "Pauline Privilege". (If the divorce occurs after the baptism, the baptized spouse must not have caused the breakup.)
- 4. If your ex-spouse was previously married and that marriage appears to be valid,** complete a petition for a Declaration of Nullity due to Ligamen or prior bond. (A marriage to a divorcee is often invalid due to the divorcee's prior bond of marriage.)
- 5. Other:** In all other cases, complete a petition for a formal case.
